

160-Acre Regional Park Proposed for East Paskapoo Slopes



This green space will be dedicated as a City park, preserving the many kilometres of pathways now present.

The Trinity Hills community will come with an exceptional dedication of private land to the City of Calgary for the creation of a regional park.

A 160-acre park will be created on the upper slopes of the land immediately east of Canada Olympic Park. And along the land adjacent to the TransCanada Highway, Trinity is planning a unique, mixed-use community that promises to set the standard for a future of more sustainable urban living at Calgary's premier western gateway.

The new regional park will see the existing pathway system on the upper slopes preserved for all Calgarians to enjoy.

The long awaited regional parklands will be dedicated to the City following approval of the Trinity Hills development proposal.
