Reminder - Prohibited Items

NAVAJO METALS values doing business with you. This letter is to remind you of our stringent scrap acceptance policy.

Due to our concern for the safety of our employees and for the protection of the environment, and the increasingly stringent laws and regulations in these areas, Navajo does not accept certain materials for processing because they are potential sources of hazardous substances. Navajo has been and will continue to be very diligent on the types of scrap it can accept. In addition to strict regulations of hazardous materials, existing federal and provincial laws assign liability for potential safety infractions or cleanup of many designated hazardous substances. This liability is shared, which means that any party, including you as a supplier, contributing to the cause of safety infractions or the release of a hazardous substance into the environment can be held liable for any necessary remediation. For this reason, it is in our mutual interest to take appropriate steps to prevent inclusion or release of any hazardous substance from your scrap.

Navajo will not accept and/or remove any scrap from your premises if it contains prohibited items/components listed below. Navajo **prohibits** and **will refuse and eject:**

- Asbestos
- Any light fixtures containing ballasts
- Capacitors
- Chemical-containing scrap
- Electronic scrap containing printed circuit boards
- Lead-containing scrap
- Medical scrap
- Mercury-containing scrap
- Radioactive scrap
- Sludge-containing scrap
- Any gas bottles/cylinders/tanks.
- Any scrap that contains disproportionate amounts of dirt/soil, rocks, woods, rubber, tires, general garbage, unattached plastic, paper and glass products, as well as other non-metallic materials.
